 - o Grade Allotments

 - C. Vice President/Principal Report Andrew Boeke
 - Testing
 - MAP testing is still going on; remote kids are coming in on Wednesdays
 - Helps guide teachers' instruction
 - Window for testing closes February 25
 - Will try to get kids who missed to make the test up
 - Paper copies of results will come home about a week after conferences.
 - Ohio State Test (starts in 3rd grade)
 - 3rd Grade Reading Guarantee is exempt this year, but the state is still expecting the testing to be completed.
 - Planning on it to be in April but waiting to hear more direction due to a bill waiting to pass through the legislature
 - o CogAT
 - 2nd and 5th Grades

- Group administered IQ test; required by state of Ohio
- Plan is to do this in March (traditionally, 2nd grade would be in January, 5th grade in October)
- Timed test via pencil and paper
- Picture Day
 - This Friday, February 19. If it gets cancelled, we will reschedule.
 - Will be using classroom space (Zink, Felsburg, and photobooth area for family night)
 - Remote learners are 3:00-5:00 pm
 - No paper order forms; everything is online
- Conferences
 - Next week via Zoom
 - Communication should have come from teachers
 - Next Wednesday is round 2 vaccines for staff so there will be no live teaching next Wednesday; no school next Thursday or Friday
- 5th Grade Intervention Specialist, Mary Lynn Scaglione, is retiring this year.
- We hired a new tech teacher, Christina Frasca
- New Quarantine Rules
 - Question: Were more kids in quarantine testing positive?
 - Answer: Not kid-to-kid at Weller. Since January, in at least 3 buildings, there was an increase in kid-to-kid spread based on kids that were fully masked within 6 feet but outside of 3 feet.
- Kicking Off Otis Spunkmeyer on Tuesday
 - Will be kicked off virtually via a video link in the classrooms
 - \circ $\;$ Andrew and Nick will also talk to kids about it in the lunchroom
 - Prizes using the company's prize poster; \$50 raffle; name on the sign outside for top boy and girl; extra recess monitored by Andrew for the topselling class from each grade

- Scholarship
 - Student applications are due April 7 and recipient's name is due May 7
 - Eliminating in person scholarship event and creating an electronic presentation that will highlight the community organizations the programs the winner was part of. This will be released via the CHS website and social media in May.

- B. Box Tops/Coke Codes Spring Collection April Whitehead
- Box Tops Deadline to be submitted is March 1
- Collected 138 physical Box Tops (\$13.80) and we have about \$30 in scans, so we are anticipating under \$50

- C. Reading Challenge Rachel Casey
- March 2-16; Theme is "Reading is Magical"
- Prizes
 - Raffle will be paperless to keep traffic out of the hallway. No raffle tickets; instead, it will be based on total number of minutes read on the reading log. We will enter it in a spreadsheet and input that many entries in based on minutes they turn in. They choose which prize they want their raffle tickets to go towards and we will choose winners of raffle prizes from there via a website.

 - Kids are Tops Gift Basket (Donated)

 - School-wide goal will be 120,000 minutes all students will get a small treat such as a sucker.

 - We will acknowledge the top 1 or 2 readers per grade by having them pick a book in the school library with a dedication sticker as a top reader (similar to the birthday book process). This is pending confirmation of feasibility with Mrs. Rieger.
